Samford's bell tower symbol has been used in the school's primary logo in several forms over the last three decades. It is a symbol of time-honored tradition and scholarly excellence. The hands on the clock inside the logo are set at 6 and 5 to reflect the verse engraved on the front gates of our beautiful campus taken from Deuteronomy 6:5 and Mark 12:30-31: "Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy strength, and with all thy mind: and thy neighbor as thyself."

Time may be a thief, but it can never steal the love you have for your children. Now you are entrusting your sons and daughters to Samford University to teach and guide them over the next four years. Everyone in the Samford community commits to do all within our ability to help them reach their full potential and eternal calling. It is our privilege to partner with you in raising the next generation of Samford women and men.



MOVE-IN AND CONNECTIONS:

This year, two days have been set aside for new student move-in—Thursday, August 17, and Friday, August 18. For students attending Bulldog Days in August, move-in will be Wednesday, August 16. Students will select a day and time to move in. Upperclassmen will choose from move-in appointments on August 13, 14, 15, 19, or 20.

When you arrive on the day of your student's chosen move in, signage will direct you and volunteers will greet you to help you know where you may offload your student's belongings and then park. 


